The green campus concept offers an institution the opportunity to take the lead in redefining its environmental culture and developing new paradigms by creating sustainable solutions to environmental, social and economic needs of the mankind.

Greening the campus is all about sweeping away wasteful inefficiencies and using conventional sources of energies for its daily power needs, correct disposal handling, purchase of environment friendly supplies and effective recycling program. Institute has to work out the time bound strategies to implement green campus initiatives. These strategies need to be incorporated into the institutional planning and budgeting processes with the aim of developing a clean and green campus.

Energy:



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Reduce energy consumption:

In this context Bhimavaram Institute of Engineering and Technology therefore has adopted the following policies.

a) Activate power management features on your computer and monitor so that it will go into a low power “sleep” mode when you are not working on it.

b) Turn off your monitor when you leave your Table.

c) Turn off unnecessary lights and use daylight instead.

d) Use LED or compact fluorescent bulbs as much as possible

e) Switch off lights, fans in conference rooms, classrooms, lecture halls when they are not in use.

f) Implement solar system to cut down the heavy usage of electricity.

Water:

Minimize consumption of water. In this context Bhimavaram Institute of Engineering and Technology therefore has adopted the following policies.

a) Repair sources of water leakage, such as dripping taps and showers as quickly as possible.

b) Install appliances which reduce water consumption.

c) Encourage use of recycled rainwater and grey water to reduce mains water consumption.

d) Reuse the water coming out RO water purification systems for washing clothes and garments in hostels.

Waste:

Waste minimization is very important because it makes good business sense to protect the environment and boost environmental performance. Waste minimization techniques focus on preventing waste from ever being created, otherwise known as source reduction, and recycling. Bhimavaram Institute of Engineering and Technology therefore commits to:

a) Keep a stack of paper that has been printed on one side and use it for day to day rough paper work.



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b) Use more readout material in soft form. Reduce the hard readout material. Use more of e-mail for officially communicating the information needed, online reading etc.

c) Minimize the use of fertilizers and pesticides in college grounds, opting for the use of compost produced on site wherever possible.

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POLICY FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

The college has created a resourceful and inspiring academic ambience world class infrastructure. The college is Private Self Financing Institution. The college is approved by AICTE, New Delhi. The college is permanently affiliated to Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University, Kakinada (JNTU-K).

Objectives of the Policy

Disability
